FRIDAY, 12TH SEPTEMBER, 1919.

1. MEETING OF SENATE.—The Senate met at eleven a.m., pursuant to adjournment.
2. PRAYERS.
3. QUESTIONS.—Questions on notice were answered.
4. PAPERS.—The Minister for Repatriation (Senator Millen) laid on the Table the following Papers,

5. POSTPONEMENT.—Ordered—That Private Business, Notice of Motion No. 1, be postponed until Thursday, 13th November next.
6. ALIENS REGISTRATION BILL.—Order of the Day read for the adjourned debate on the Question—
That the Bill be now read a second time.
Debate resumed.

Bill read a second time.
