FRIDAY, 27TH JUNE, 1941.

1. MEETING OF SENATE.—The Senate met at ten a.m., pursuant to adjournment.

2. PRAYERS.

5. SUPPLY BILL (No. 1) 1941-42.—Order of the Day read for the adjourned debate on the Question—
 That the Bill be now read a first time.
 Debate resumed.
 Question—put and passed.
 Bill read a first time.
 On the motion of the Minister for Supply and Development (Senator McLeay) the Bill was read a second time.
 The Senate, according to Order, resolved itself into Committee for the consideration of the Bill.

 The Schedule debated and agreed to.
 Preamble agreed to.
 Title agreed to.
 Bill to be reported without requests.
