3. DEATH OF THE HONORABLE J. S. ROSEVEAR, M.P.—The Minister for Trade and Customs (Senator O'Sullivan), having referred with deep regret to the death of the Honorable J. S. Rosevear, M.P., which occurred on 21st March, moved, by leave—

That the Senate expresses its deep regret at the death of the Honorable John Solomon Rosevear, Member of the House of Representatives for the Division of Dalley and former Speaker of the House of Representatives, places on record its appreciation of his long and meritorious public service, and tenders its sincere sympathy to his widow and members of his family in their bereavement.

And the motion having been seconded by the Leader of the Opposition (Senator McKenna), and supported by the Minister for Repatriation (Senator Cooper) and Senators Ashley and Amour—And all Senators present having risen, in silence—

Question—passed.
