5     The Parliament of Australia enacts:

6     **Part 1—Preliminary**  
7

8     **1 Short title**

9             This Act may be cited as the *Appropriation Act (No. 1) 2004-2005*.

1       **2 Commencement**

2               This Act commences on the day on which it receives the Royal  
3               Assent.

4       **3 Definitions**

5               In this Act, unless the contrary intention appears:

6               **administered item** means an amount set out in Schedule 1 opposite  
7               an outcome of an entity under the heading “Administered  
8               Expenses”.

9               **Agency** means any of the following:

- 10              (a) an Agency within the meaning of the *Financial Management*  
11              and *Accountability Act 1997*;  
12              (b) the High Court.

13              **Agency Minister**, in relation to an Agency, means the Minister  
14              responsible for the Agency.

15              **Chief Executive** has the same meaning as in the *Financial*  
16              *Management and Accountability Act 1997*.

17              **Commonwealth authority** has the same meaning as in the  
18              *Commonwealth Authorities and Companies Act 1997*.

19              **Commonwealth company** has the same meaning as in the  
20              *Commonwealth Authorities and Companies Act 1997*.

21              **current year** means the financial year ending on 30 June 2005.

22              **departmental item** means the total amount set out in Schedule 1 in  
23              relation to an entity under the heading “Departmental Outputs”.

24              Note:       The amounts set out opposite outcomes, under the heading  
25                           “Departmental Outputs”, are “notional”. They are not part of the item,  
26                           and do not in any way restrict the scope of the expenditure authorised  
27                           by the item.

28              **entity** means any of the following:

- 29              (a) an Agency;  
30              (b) a Commonwealth authority;

(c) a Commonwealth company;

(d) the Australian National Training Authority.

**expenditure** means payments for expenses, acquiring assets, making loans or paying liabilities.

**Finance Minister** means the Minister administering this Act.

**item** means an administered item or a departmental item.

**Portfolio Budget Statements** means the Portfolio Budget Statements that were tabled in the Senate or the House of Representatives in relation to the Bill for this Act.

**section 31 agreement** means an agreement under section 31 of the *Financial Management and Accountability Act 1997*.

**Special Account** has the same meaning as in the *Financial Management and Accountability Act 1997*.

#### **4 Portfolio Budget Statements**

- (1) The Portfolio Budget Statements are hereby declared to be relevant documents for the purposes of section 15AB of the *Acts Interpretation Act 1901*.

Note: See paragraph 15AB(2)(g) of the *Acts Interpretation Act 1901*.

- (2) If the Portfolio Budget Statements indicate that activities of a particular kind were intended to be treated as activities in respect of a particular outcome, then expenditure for the purpose of carrying out those activities is taken to be expenditure for the purpose of contributing to achieving the outcome.

#### **5 Notional payments, receipts etc.**

For the purposes of this Act, notional transactions between Agencies are to be treated as if they were real transactions.

Note: This section applies, for example, to a “payment” between Agencies that are both part of the Commonwealth. One of the effects of this section is that the payment will be debited from an appropriation for the paying Agency, even though no payment is actually made from the Consolidated Revenue Fund.

## Part 2—Basic appropriations

### 6 Summary of basic appropriations

The total of the items specified in Schedule 1 is \$45,060,041,000.

Note 1: Items in Schedule 1 can be increased under Part 3 of this Act.

Note 2: See also section 30A of the *Financial Management and Accountability Act 1997*, which provides for adjustment of appropriations to take account of GST.

### 7 Departmental items—basic appropriation

- (1) For a departmental item for an entity, the Finance Minister may issue out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund amounts that do not exceed, in total, the amount specified in the item.

Note: Generally, the Finance Minister is permitted, but not obliged, to issue the amounts out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund. However, subsections (3) and (4) impose an obligation on the Finance Minister to issue the amounts in certain circumstances.

- (2) An amount issued out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund for a departmental item for an entity may only be applied for the departmental expenditure of the entity.

Note: The acquisition of *new* departmental assets will usually be funded from an other departmental item (in another Appropriation Act).

- (3) If:

- (a) an Act provides that an entity must be paid amounts that are appropriated by the Parliament for the purposes of the entity; and

(b) Schedule 1 contains a departmental item for that entity; then the Finance Minister, under subsection (1), must issue out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund the full amount specified in the item.

- (4) If a departmental item for an Agency includes provision for payment of remuneration and allowances to the holder of:



- 1 (a) a public office (within the meaning of the *Remuneration*  
 2 *Tribunal Act 1973*); or  
 3 (b) an office specified in a Schedule to the *Remuneration and*  
 4 *Allowances Act 1990*;  
 5 then the Finance Minister, under subsection (1), must issue out of  
 6 the Consolidated Revenue Fund, under that item, amounts that are  
 7 sufficient to pay the remuneration and allowances and must apply  
 8 the amounts for that purpose.

## 9 **8 Administered items—basic appropriation**

- 10 (1) For an administered item for an outcome of an entity, the Finance  
 11 Minister may issue out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund amounts  
 12 that do not exceed, in total, the lesser of:  
 13 (a) the amount specified in the item; and  
 14 (b) the amount determined by the Finance Minister in relation to  
 15 the item, having regard to the expenses incurred by the entity  
 16 in the current year in relation to the item.
- 17 (2) An amount issued out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund for an  
 18 administered item for an outcome of an entity may only be applied  
 19 for expenditure for the purpose of carrying out activities for the  
 20 purpose of contributing to achieving that outcome.

21 Note: The acquisition of *new* administered assets will usually be funded  
 22 from an administered assets and liabilities item (in another  
 23 Appropriation Act).

## 24 **9 Reduction of appropriations upon request**

- 25 (1) The Finance Minister may, upon written request by a Minister,  
 26 make a written determination under this section reducing a  
 27 departmental item for an entity for which the Minister is  
 28 responsible by the amount specified in the determination.
- 29 (2) The Finance Minister may, upon written request by the Chief  
 30 Executive of an entity for which the Finance Minister is  
 31 responsible, make a written determination under this section  
 32 reducing a departmental item for that entity by the amount  
 33 specified in the determination.

**Section 9**

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- 1           (3) Where a determination is made, the amount specified in the item is  
2           taken to have been reduced by the amount specified in the  
3           determination.
- 4           (4) However, a determination is of no effect if the determination has  
5           not been requested under subsection (1) or (2).
- 6           (5) In addition, a determination reduces an amount specified in the  
7           item only to the extent that the amount of the reduction is no  
8           greater than the lesser of the following:  
9           (a) the amount requested under subsection (1) or (2);  
10          (b) the difference between the amount specified in the item and  
11          the amount issued out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund by  
12          the Finance Minister in respect of that item.
- 13          (6) For the purposes of paragraph (5)(b), an amount is not taken to  
14          have been issued by the Finance Minister until the amount is paid  
15          out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund.
- 16          (7) To avoid doubt, where a previous determination has been made in  
17          relation to an item, the reference in paragraph (5)(b) to the amount  
18          specified in the item is taken to be a reference to the amount  
19          specified in the item as reduced by that previous determination and  
20          any other previous determination.
- 21          (8) To avoid doubt, a determination under this section applies despite  
22          any other provision of this Act.
- 23          (9) A determination under this section is a disallowable instrument for  
24          the purposes of section 46A of the *Acts Interpretation Act 1901*.

## Part 3—Additions to basic appropriations

### 10 Net appropriations

#### *Departmental items*

- (1) If a section 31 agreement applies to a departmental item, then the amount specified in the item is taken to be increased in accordance with the agreement, and on the conditions set out in the agreement. The increase cannot be more than the relevant receipts covered by the agreement.
- (2) For the purposes of section 31 of the *Financial Management and Accountability Act 1997*, each departmental item is taken to be marked “net appropriation”.

#### *Administered items*

- (3) If a section 31 agreement applies to an administered item, then the amount specified in the item is taken to be increased in accordance with the agreement, and on the conditions set out in the agreement. The increase cannot be more than the relevant receipts covered by the agreement.
- (4) For the purposes of section 31 of the *Financial Management and Accountability Act 1997*, the following administered items are taken to be marked “net appropriation”:
  - (a) the administered item for outcome 3 of the Department of Finance and Administration;
  - (b) the administered item for outcome 2 of the Department of Industry, Tourism and Resources;
  - (c) the administered item for outcome 1 of the Australian Agency for International Development;
  - (d) the administered item for outcome 1 of the Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Services;
  - (e) the administered item for outcome 2 of the Department of Transport and Regional Services.

Section 11

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**11 Departmental items—adjustments**

- (1) The Finance Minister may determine that the amount specified in a departmental item is to be increased by an amount specified in the determination.
- (2) The total of the amounts determined by the Finance Minister under this section for all departmental items cannot be more than \$20 million.
- (3) The Finance Minister must give the Parliament details of increases made under this section.

**12 Advance to the Finance Minister—unforeseen expenditure etc.**

- (1) This section applies if the Finance Minister is satisfied that:
  - (a) there is an urgent need for expenditure that is not provided for, or is insufficiently provided for, in Schedule 1; and
  - (b) the additional expenditure is not provided for, or is insufficiently provided for, in Schedule 1:
    - (i) because of an erroneous omission or understatement; or
    - (ii) because the additional expenditure was unforeseen until after the last day on which it was practicable to provide for it in the Bill for this Act before that Bill was introduced into the House of Representatives.
- (2) This Act has effect as if Schedule 1 were amended, in accordance with a determination of the Finance Minister, to make provision for so much (if any) of the additional expenditure as the Finance Minister determines.
- (3) The total of the amounts determined under this section cannot be more than \$175 million.
- (4) The Finance Minister must give the Parliament details of amounts determined under this section.

### 13 Comcover receipts

- (1) This section applies whenever an amount (the *Comcover payment*) is debited from The Comcover Account in respect of a payment to an Agency.

Note: The Comcover Account is a Special Account for the purposes of the *Financial Management and Accountability Act 1997*.

- (2) Amounts totalling the full amount of the Comcover payment must be added to an available item or items for the Agency. For this purpose, *available item* means an item in Schedule 1 to this Act or in a Schedule to the *Appropriation Act (No. 2) 2004-2005*.

- (3) The items and respective amounts are to be determined by the Agency Minister. In making a determination, the Agency Minister must comply with any written directions given by the Finance Minister.

- (4) The Agency Minister may delegate his or her powers under this section to the Chief Executive of the Agency.

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## **Part 4—Miscellaneous**

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### **14 Crediting amounts to Special Accounts**

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If any of the purposes of a Special Account is a purpose that is covered by an item (whether or not the item expressly refers to the Special Account), then amounts may be debited against the appropriation for that item and credited to that Special Account.

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### **15 Appropriation of the Consolidated Revenue Fund**

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The Consolidated Revenue Fund is appropriated as necessary for the purposes of this Act.
